

Ashlynne McGhee joins 7am as new host; Ange McCormack to conclude tenure with week-long series on Australia's housing crisis

Current host Ange McCormack's departure will conclude with *7am*'s latest special series, 'The Great Housing Disaster', which will be published from Monday, April 15. The week-long five-part series will investigate the origins, consequences and political fallout of Australia's worst housing crisis on record.

The series promises to explain how the housing crisis impacts everyday Australians – from housing affordability and rental rights, to public housing and generational inequality. It will also explore the arguments over the solutions to the crisis, and investigate what's at stake if we fail to make housing more accessible.

"As someone who has personally experienced the housing crisis unfold and watched it impact my generation, this series helps answer questions I've long had," says McCormack. "It is an urgent analysis into how Australia dug itself into this mess – and how we can genuinely be hopeful about getting out of it."

Throughout the week, McCormack will interview politicians, economists, activists and academics – including Minister for Housing Julie Collins, Alan Kohler, Jordan van den Berg, Max Chandler-Mather, Carolyn Ienna, Nicole Gurran and more.

Ruby Jones will return from maternity leave as *7am*'s host and executive producer in the second half of the year.
